At Old Eastcote, go straight at the first mini roundabout and then at the second turn left into Joel Street. Follow Joel Street for about a mile and a half, right through Northwood Hills. At the end of Northwood Hills shopping street, there is a roundabout, take first left into Pinner Road. Just before the Iron Railway Bridge turn right into the High Street. Emmanuel Church is about 300 yards on the left.
